Course Objectives

This course aims to:

- To enable students to understand, evaluate and apply different models and theories related to intercultural competence
- To provide students with a learning environment that allows for experiencing the benefits and challenges of intercultural encounters in general, and of multicultural teamwork in particular
- To deepen students' intercultural understanding by helping them reflect on the experiences made in class.

Methods of Teaching and Learning

The learning and teaching strategy are designed to develop knowledge and understanding in both theoretical and practical perspectives. In addition to self-directed learning, the teaching and learning methods include a mixture of seminars and lectures with student interactions.

This way, attendance is expected for the entirety of all class sessions. Students who do not attend 80% of the total class time will automatically receive a negative course grade. If students have scheduling conflicts, they must notify the lecturer at least 24 hours in advance. Absences that are not communicated with lecturers before the start of the session will not be excused. Consequently, any missed graded component in the respective session will result in a negative component grade.

Assessment Strategy

Class participation:

Students are required to attend at least 80% of lessons in order to remain eligible for grading as well as not to miss out neither on content nor interaction with their colleagues.

Scoring system:

A total of 100 points can be achieved in this course and the grade distribution as follows:

90 – 100 points	Sehr gut	1
80 – 89 points	Gut	2
70 – 79 points	Befriedigend	3
60 – 69 points	Genügend	4
< 59 points	Nicht Genügend	5

The 100 points are distributed between individual assessment (60%) and group assessment (40%). For a passing grade students must obtain at least 50% in each category AND at least 60% of the total points.

In details:

Individual assessment:

- Reflective essay (50 points):
 - This assignment should be based upon a short qualitative interview with somebody having intercultural experience. It should contain a reflective analysis about the interviewee's experience assessing and integrating own learning and personal reflection throughout the course on the interpretative approach as well as reflection on the interpretative viewpoint. Students also need to incorporate at least 3 pieces of academic references in an 8.000-10.000 characters-long paper to create connection between their own learning and the literature.
- Self-assessing: Active participation during classes (10 points):
 Self-assessment of the students' contribution to the classes learned and understood the fundamental concepts and can critically think while applying concepts learned in the course.

Team assessment:

- Case study project (40 points):
 - Team should analyze 1 case study from the Mahadevan-Primecz-Romani case study book on Moodle from a critical CCM point of view with assessing and integrating own learning throughout the course. It should also include the team reflection on the critical viewpoint. Students need to incorporate at least 3 pieces of academic references in this 8-10 slide-long presentation to create connection between their own learning and the literature.

Reflective essays are expected to follow the rules of academic writing. Please, note that there is *no* replacement exam for the essays as it is a home assignment and you are free to use any sources. Please, also note that deadline is strict and it is not possible to move it. Please, avoid using Chat GPT or any similar AI text producing software. If you choose to support your work with such AI software (e.g. for language editing), include a paragraph at the end of any assignment that uses AI explaining what you used the AI for and what prompts you used to get the results. Failure to do so is in violation of academic honesty policies. AI detection and plagiarism checking apply for all submitted papers.
